FREEMASONRY AND ENGLAND'S ROYAL CONNECTION

EDITOR'S NOTE: Much of what follows is taken by an article written in 2012 by Bro. John Hamil, Director of Special Projects & Columnist for Freemasonry Today.

On November 5, 2012, English Freemasons celebrated the 275th of the initiation of HRH Frederick Lewis, Prince of Wales, the first member of the English Royal Family to become a Freemason. The eldest son of King George II, Frederick Lewis did not come to the throne, as he died in 1751 at the early age of forty-four. Frederick Lewis was made a Freemason in what was termed an 'occasional' lodge, presided over by the Reverend Doctor J.T. Desaguliers, Grand Master in 1737.

It would be interesting to speculate if Frederick Lewis discussed Freemasonry within his family, for one of his brothers and three of his sons went on to become Freemasons. The youngest of his sons, Henry Frederick, Duke of Cumberland (1745-1790), had rapid promotions. In 1782 he became our first Royal Grand Master and held that office until his untimely death in 1790.

Henry Frederick introduced the next generation of royalty to the fraternity, with sons of King George III becoming Freemasons. Three of them went on to serve as Grand Master: George, Prince of Wales (later Prince Regent and King George IV) succeeded his uncle as Grand Master in 1791 and served until he became Prince Regent in 1812, when he was succeeded by his younger brother Augustus Frederick, Duke of Sussex. At the same time, their brother Edward, Duke of Kent, became Grand Master of the Antients Grand Lodge.

With two royal brothers at their head in 1813, the two Grand Lodges came together as the United Grand Lodge of England, with the Duke of Sussex as Grand Master. Sussex was determined that he would succeed, and put in place a number

of procedures that today still form the basis of the government of the English Craft.

The death of the Duke of Sussex in 1843 marked a twenty-five-year period without royal participation for the simple reason that – with the exception of Queen Victoria's husband, Prince Albert – there were no princes of an age to join. That situation was happily rectified in 1868 when the then Prince of Wales (later King Edward VII) became a Freemason on a visit to Sweden. In 1869 he was elected a Past Grand Master and in 1874 became Grand Master, holding office until he came to the throne in 1901 when he took the title of Protector of Freemasonry.

The Prince of Wales was soon joined by two of his brothers, the Duke of Connaught and the Duke of Albany, and brought in his son, the Duke of Clarence. The Duke of Connaught succeeded his brother as Grand Master in 1901 and was to be an active ruler until 1939. He was supported by his son Prince Arthur and by his great nephews, the then Prince of Wales (later King Edward VIII and Duke of Windsor); the Duke of York (later King George VI); and the Duke of Kent, father of our present Grand Master. The Duke of Kent succeeded as Grand Master in 1939 but his rule was cut cruelly short when he was killed in an RAF air crash in 1942.

Today, English Freemasonry is fortunate to still have Royal support. HRH The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh became a Master Mason in Navy Lodge, No. 2612, of which he is still a subscribing member. HRH The Duke of Kent has been our Grand Master since 1967 and his wise counsel and great support in what has been a turbulent time for English Freemasonry, have been invaluable. His brother HRH Prince Michael of Kent has given long service as Provincial Grand Master for Middlesex.

AMENDMENT TO BY-LAWS

Section 5. Arrears

ORIGINAL TEXT OF BYLAWS

(a) ~~A member in arrears for one year's dues after a period of twelve calendar months and after being duly summoned by the Secretary, may be unaffiliated by a majority of members present and voting.~~

(b) ~~If in arrears for two years, a member must be summoned by the Secretary by certified mail, return receipt requested, postmarked no later than the 31st day of October, to show cause to the Master why he should not be unaffiliated. When a member is so summoned and fails to pay the dues, the Master shall constitute an Investigating Committee to investigate the reasons therefore and report the results to the Lodge at the Annual Communication following the date of such summons, for such action as a majority of the members present there decide.~~

(c) ~~A member in arrears for an assessment after twelve calendar months following the levy thereof, after being duly summoned, may, in the discretion of the Master, be charged with failure to perform his Masonic duty in accordance with the Constitutions of Grand Lodge and be disciplined pursuant thereto. [Amended. 920 April 2, 2012] [Deleted. 964 February 1, 2016]~~

VOID AMENDMENT

A Brother of the Lodge in arrears for one year's dues after a period of twelve calendar months ending on December 31st shall be notified by the Secretary by certified mail, return receipt requested, postmarked no later than then February 1st that following year that he is summoned before the Master to pay his outstanding indebtedness to the Lodge or set up some type of payment plan to ameliorate this outstanding past year debt and any current year's dues that are do January The Master's summons must be answered by the Brother no later than April's stated communication. If the Master's summons to pay the arrears of dues outstanding was not answered by the Brother by the April communication, the Master at his discretion (but no later than the December stated communication) may bring the Brother before the Lodge to be voted by majority of members present as an unaffiliated member of the Lodge for non payment of dues according to Section 691 of the Constitution of Grand Lodge of the State of New York. [Added. 964 February 1, 2016]

AMENDMENT TO BY-LAWS, cont.*(cont. from page 8)*

NEW BY-LAW DISTRIBUTED & VOTED ON MARCH 6, 2017:

Section 5. Arrears.

A Brother's Lodge Dues are due on January 1st each year. A Brother of the Lodge is considered in arrears for the current dues if they have not paid by October 31st of that same year. A Brother in arrears shall be summoned by the Master to pay his arrears of dues in full. The summons will be sent via certified mail with a return receipt request with a postmark no later than November 1 of that year. The Master's summons must be answered by the Brother no later than the date of the stated communication for December's Annual Meeting. If the Master's summons is not answered by the December lodge meeting, then the Master shall bring the Brother's name to the attention of the Brethren present for the purpose of announcing a vote for un-affiliation. The Brother or Brothers name(s) will be printed in the January Stated Communication and the vote for un-affiliation will take place as the first order of business.

At any time during the year if a brother communicates that he is experiencing hardship affecting his ability to pay his dues, then the Investigating Committee will be dispatched to investigate his claim. The chair of that committee must report the hardship within 30 days of the investigation to the Master their findings. If a Brother communicates after December's Annual Meeting the Investigating Committee will be dispatched & tasked with providing a report by December 31st of that year for the Master to review.

The Master has the right to review the Investigating Committee's report to extend the Brother's ability to pay the current year's dues in full by February 1st of the ensuing year to avoid being un-affiliated. This promise must be made in writing or sent via email.

****Footnotes Not part of bi-law

****Note that if a Master Mason pays his dues in full for the current year by December 31st as written in the Constitution, we must then extend him the same courtesy of having paid his dues in full, to pay his dues in full anytime during the subsequent year.

**** We will also be sending out statements each quarter to the brother(s) about their dues being due for that year.

***The WM by November 1st shall notify Grand Lodge of any annual dues, which may not be paid by a Brother due to hardships for relief of the per-capita fee assed for that current year which is due by January 1st of the ensuing year.

RECENT RULINGS BY THE GRAND MASTER

Several Rulings by the Grand Master have been received by the Lodge, and will be read at the April 3 Stated Communication. What follows is a summary of items covered.

Can a candidate who is a Registered Sex Offender become a Master Mason.

Answer: No.

Masons believe in redemption. A Candidate who Answers honestly all questions on his Petition and all subsequent questions posed by a Lodge's Investigating Committee, can nevertheless seek membership even where significant blemishes remain on the Candidate's record. A Lodge is empowered to determine, in nearly all instances, that a Candidate is worthy and well-qualified, even having overcome past obstacles.

Yet, men who commit crimes that subject them to register as Sex Offenders are deemed by the State to be at risk for committing another sex crime and further harm to the community.

Does the Grand Master have the inherent right to exercise disciplinary powers upon a Master Mason who has been arrested for the Forcible Rape and Sodomy of a Child and forbid his presence at Masonic meetings, functions and gatherings?

Answer: Yes.

While it is accurate that no Mason may be punished for a Masonic offense except upon conviction on a Masonic trial, the Lodge, the Master and the Grand Master have

inherent rights to exercise disciplinary powers.

As far back as 1869, by Order adopted at the same Communication, the Grand Lodge recognized that a Lodge may punish a brother guilty of contempt by exclusion for the evening, or, for disturbing the harmony of the Lodge.

Is it a violation of Masonic Law for a Mason to secretly record the conversation of another Mason?

Answer: Yes.

This is most certainly a decision of first impression, as in years past the state of technology did not permit such conduct. While New York State is a "one-party consent" State, which means that it is a crime to record or eavesdrop on an in-person or telephone conversation unless one party to the conversation consents, it is nevertheless a violation of our Masonic Law for one Brother to surreptitiously, without knowledge or consent, record the conversation with, or of, another Brother.

May New York Masons wear the United Grand Lodge of England 300th Anniversary Jewel.

Answer: No.

At the direction of the Most Worshipful Jeffrey M. Williamson, Grand Master of Masons in the State of New York, the 300th Anniversary Jewel cannot be worn by members of Lodges under the Grand Lodge of New York.
